Books-to-Go Outreach Services Provided by WCPL

[Williams County Public Library](#) in Bryan, Ohio, along with its branches in Edgerton, Edon, Pioneer, Stryker and West Unity, reaches out to patrons by providing services to seniors and other people who are unable to visit the library.

Patrons who qualify for homebound services include any residents of Williams County who are confined at home, the hospital, or nursing home, or have mobility limitations and do not drive. Delivery can be on a short-term or long-term basis to those who are homebound, physically handicapped, or visually impaired.

Materials that can be delivered free of charge include books (both large print and regular), audio books, videos and DVDs, music CDs and magazines. Currently 136 visits per month are made by the Outreach Services Coordinator. In addition to individual patron deliveries, the Outreach Services Coordinator also maintains and stocks a rotating collection at eight stations. These locations include nursing homes, hospitals, senior citizen centers and retirement communities that do not have direct access to a library.

Additionally, the Outreach Services Coordinator is available to provide assistance to those who need it on how to use the talking book digital players that are provided to sight-limited people through the State Library of Ohio Talking Book Program. The talking books are circulated by the Ohio Library for the Blind and Physically Disabled in Cleveland.
