- One LETTER OF COMMITMENT: GOVERNING AUTHORITY (with original signatures)


Step 2:



Veterans' History Project Ceremony

Secretary of State Jesse White hosted a ceremony in Springfield Monday commemorating the success of the [Illinois Veterans' History Project](#). The initiative begun by White seven years ago provides a permanent database of the names and stories of Illinois veterans and civilians who served during times of war.

"In 2005, we created the Illinois Veterans' History Project," said White. "Today, there are more than 6,000 records from veterans who have submitted their stories to the project. Countless words have been written and spoken about the brave men and women who served our nation. But I believe the most important words are those that are written and spoken by the heroes themselves. The Illinois Veterans' History Project provides a permanent home to honor our country and our veterans, and it also reminds us of the men and women who gave their lives and made the ultimate sacrifice."
