

Improved Business/Residence Finder Service

As a state employee, you have access to a very useful service from **ReferenceUSA** that helps you find information (address, phone #, etc.) on **U.S. and Canadian businesses and residents**. That service had recently been expanded and improved. For those of you who haven't tried it, this is a great time to do so.

First, how do you get to it? Start with the State Library website www.library.ohio.gov and click on **State Employees** at the top left. On the **State Employee Resources** page, click on the ReferenceUSA link under **Electronic Reference Resources**. You will then be asked to enter your name (last/first) and the **last nine digits** of the number on your State Library card.

- Ignore the LOG ON button at the top of the screen – it is not needed.
- There is a set # of records per session that can be printed or downloaded.
- Email addresses cannot be obtained under our contract.

ReferenceUSA is divided into two major categories – **Business Databases** and **Consumer Databases**. Under the Business category are **U.S. Businesses, Canadian Businesses, and U.S. Healthcare**. Consumer Databases has two – **U.S. Residential** and **Canadian Residential**. The U.S. Residential database is divided into **Standard White Pages** and **Consumer**, which are two different information sources that they use.

Let's say that you want the addresses of all the **Burger Kings in Ohio** – a whopper of a question! That can be handled with a **Quick Search** in the U.S. Businesses

database, so click on that and enter Burger King in the **Business Name** box, set the drop-down list of states to Ohio, and click on **Search Now**. I got 339 of them.

All three Business Databases can use a **Custom Search** by clicking on that and choosing your search criteria – the parts of the records (name, zip code, SIC code, etc.) that you want to find. This allows you to get more or less information than is found with a Quick Search. The Custom Search in the U.S. Businesses database is the most flexible.

Finding People

Assignment: find all of the people in Ohio with the surname of **Davenport**. Start with a Quick Search in the U.S. Residential database, choose **Standard White Pages**, and then click on **Save Database Type** at the bottom left of the page. Entering Davenport in the Last Name box, choosing Ohio from the drop-down states list and clicking on the **Search Now** button got me 542 results.

Try the exact same search, but choose **Consumer** rather than Standard White Pages. I got 1,128 results, more than twice as many than were found in the first search. This is because a Standard White Pages search only finds the persons who have land line phones (even if their # is unlisted). Consumer searches will often find additional persons in a household and those who are nonlisted because they do not have land lines. **Note:** unlisted and nonlisted phone numbers cannot be found with this service.
