Packard Library at CCAD

The college, founded as the Columbus Art School in 1879 as an adjunct to the Columbus Gallery of Fine Arts (now the Columbus Museum of Art), moved to its current location in Columbus' Discovery District in 1914. 


Rose Melnick Medical Museum
